This Sunday we focus on the parable of the Pharisee and the Publican as the fresco labels it - publican being a word for tax collector back in Roman times (Luke 18:9-14). The bottom line of the parable is that God is the one who justifies. A good reminder for Reformation Sunday!

REFORMATION DAY OCTOBER 31, 1517


Martin Luther claimed that what distinguished him from previous reformers was that while they attacked corruption in the life of the church, he went to the theological root of the problem—the perversion of the church’s doctrine of redemption and grace. Luther, a pastor and professor at the University of Wittenberg, deplored the entanglement of God’s free gift of grace in a complex system of indulgences and good works. In his Ninety-five Theses, he attacked the indulgence system, insisting that the pope had no authority over purgatory and that the doctrine of the merits of the saints had no foundation in the gospel. Here lay the key to Luther’s concerns for the ethical and theological reform of the church: Scripture alone is authoritative (sola scriptura) and justification is by faith (sola fide), not by works. While he did not intend to break with the Catholic church, a

confrontation with the papacy was not long in coming. In 1521 Luther was excommunicated; what began as an internal reform movement had become a fracture in western Christendom. (Encyclopedia Britannica)



NON-VIOLENT COMMUNICATION: What are our common needs?

NVC practitioners and teachers Sharon Seymour and Rachel Garmon led a two-hour introduction to NVC on Saturday October 19 in Perkins Hall. NVC at its core is the practice of recognizing our own and others' needs before we speak out of ingrained habits or old ways: defensiveness, anger, cynicism. They prevent us from asking ourselves and others what needs do I feel, do I think they might be feeling. Empathy is described as "resting your awareness and listening attention on the speaker rather than thinking about what they're saying." In other words, it is about really listening and not simply be thinking what you are going to say as rebuttal, explanation, or rationale. It takes a lot of practice to get out of our own heads.

The photo, taken by Patty Lantrip, shows some of the needs each of us has. The teachers laid them out on the floor for us to choose which relate most to our experiences and our emotions. The last Sunday of the month Rachel and Sharon have a time to learn and practice compassionate communication. It is free and held in the lower meeting room of the Prescott Library from 2-4. I recommend it!



Throughout the year, we continue to help documented immigrant students needing assistance to meet their educational expenses. Most of our aid has been to assist Franceny Gardea, a junior at Prescott College, Franciso Gardea, a senior at the U of A. Donations to our DACA Fund are always welcome.

The immigration event we helped to plan and present September 21 at the Methodist Church was attended by over 200 people. Panelists addressed current government immigration laws, policies and practices. Guest speakers included an immigration attorney from Phoenix, an ordained Methodist immigration worker, the Humbolt-Dewey School Superintendent, and an area immigrant. Although they chose to decline, local law agencies were invited to be a part of our panel.

Monthly we provide a hot meal for women, and women with children staying at the Prescott Area Shelter Services (PASS). 


