### A Message from Gary Gard

In the immediate years following the Declaration of Independence in 1776, our nation found guidance in the Articles of the Confederation. These articles formed an agreement binding the original 13 states together. In 1787, delegates from all 13 states attended a Constitutional Convention to prepare a new constitution and form of government. With the approval of 9 of the 13 states, Congress declared that beginning on March 4, 1789, the United States would be guided by this new constitution. However, 4 states withheld their ratification. They insisted on some amendments. In an effort to move forward with a united front, in 1789 Congress submitted 12 amendments. Ten were eventually approved by all states and became a part of our Constitution in December 1791. We know these amendments as "The Bill of Rights."

Many today, anchor their rally cries from what is in the First Amendment. "Don't violate my right to free speech, or to freely assemble." Since its founding in 1789, the U.S. Supreme Court has adjudicated numerous First Amendment cases. The ruling of these judges is seen as the "Final Word." Results are affirmed as the law of the land.

As a person of faith, it seems to me that there is another set of amendments. We commonly know them as "The Beatitudes." Some refer to them as, "Life Amendments". Others as, "Ethics of God's Kingdom." They focus upon not only our personal identity, but also upon our social identity. Together, these "holy amendments" are meant to amend how we relate not just to law, but to one another. They repeat the teachings about love and compassion as found throughout the scriptures. They speak of humility, of gentleness, of being merciful; and of being not just peacekeepers, but peace-makers.

All of these amendments speak about something more basic than what is lawful. They speak about the spirit and ethics characteristic of those in God's kingdom. Something to think about, as we think about what is guiding our lives. As a person of faith, my life is not just about me.


### DACA Update
