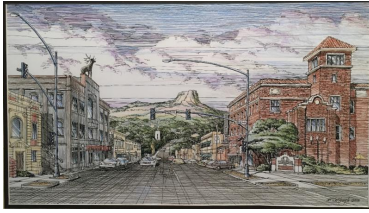
## MISSIONS NEWS
