Income as of March 31 is \$34,314.

Total expenses are \$34,837.

Total expenses exceed income by \$523.

Year-to-date income is at 28% of the income budget of \$122,450.

Year-to-date expenses are at 24% of the expense budget of \$146,905.

\$3,162 has been transferred from Special Funds reserves held in the money market account to off-set the budget deficit.
