SOUTHWEST CONFERENCE ANNUAL MEETING REPORT

As I arrived in central Phoenix, near the tram on Central and McDowell, I saw a Church steeple. I thought, "Wow, it's rare to be able to see a Church steeple in the middle of a city!" That steeple belonged to the Church where I was a delegate from Prescott to the Annual South West Conference of the United Churches of Christ along with Pastor Jay Wilcher and Patty Lantrip on April fourth through sixth of this year.

The theme for the Conference was growth. All kinds of growth were considered, not just growth in numbers but also spiritual growth, growth in reaching the disenfranchised and growth in widening the table (welcoming). We were able to meet the leaders of the only UCC Church that exists solely on line and we were also introduce to the "bl" social media network being developed by the UCC for all congregations to use as a way to see what other churches are doing.

Three of our members serve on committees in the conference, Rev. Harry Strong was elected to fill an unexpired term on the Committee on Church and Ministry-Section B, Patty Lantrip is on the Nominating Committee and Rev. Dr. Jay Wilcher is on the Committee on Church Ministry-Section A. Also Pastor Jay was recognized at the Friday night banquet for 30 years of ordained ministry.

Our Mission Outreach emphasis for April is the denomination's One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS). Almost daily we read about the plight of people uprooted from their




