

I became pastor of our church in April of 2015. My contract included granting me a three-month sabbatical after five years of service. This is customary in our UCC conference and some variation is also part of other denomination's policies. The wisdom of sabbaticals at around the five-year mark is related to studies of clergy burnout and the benefit to a congregation of longer pastorates. Studies show that cycling through pastors every 3-5 years is not healthy for the success of a church. And







studies also show that clergy tend to wear down and not perceive the spiritual, emotional, and psychological toll of ministry. Loss of creativity is also a byproduct. The insidious nature of burnout leads one not to perceive its effects - until bad consequences appear.

I am grateful for the opportunity to take a sabbatical during the months of June, July, and August of this year. A sabbatical committee has begun planning for the tasks of preaching and pastoral care during these months. We are blessed with retired clergy and lay leaders who can help us through this

### My sabbatical plan includes:

A trip to Michigan with my son to visit family.

A trip with my wife to New England and New York.

A personal spiritual retreat for renewal and reflection.

A chance to visit different church worship services each week for gathering ideas.

A time for worship and church-year planning for the next year.

A time of rest and recreation to revive creativity.

I think of the sabbatical as a chance to step off the treadmill - what I call a chance to step back from the relentless return of Sunday. My continual focus is on the next Sunday's sermon and worship service. I lack time to look at things from a larger perspective.

My hope and prayer are that this will allow all of us to get out of some ruts and go down some new paths. One of our Cabinet members likened it to driving down the interstate at high speed and missing most of what could be seen, but by taking an exit and slowing down, new landscapes come into focus. May the Spirit make it happen!






