Mission Outreach Update: Thank you for your support of our **December** mission emphasis projects. Checks were sent to The Yavapai Food Bank (Family Christmas Fund) and to the denomination's Christmas Fund.

Treasurer's note for Parish Caller January 2021

I don't have all the data yet to report fully on the December financials, so here's a preliminary report of how things are looking at the close of 2020.

At the time of this writing income for the year is at \$184,000 which exceeds the budget by more than \$16,000. Expenses are at \$176,000, exceeding the expense budget by less than \$1,000. Year-to-date income exceeds expenses by \$8,000.

You can expect a much fuller report of 2020 finances in the Treasurer's Annual Report which will be made available to you in the coming weeks. Stay tuned!

140TH CHURCH ANNIVERSARY YEAR



This photo is of persons involved with the Chinese School. I believe that it was taken at Christmas time 1895. It is the interior of the frame structure that served the First Congregational Church from 1881-1905. The pews are those made by a Prescott man and are still in use at the church, the lighting has not been replaced yet by electricity 2 and the baptismal fount is quite in evidence. The men standing are undoubtedly the sponsors of the school. Without the support of these Chinese business men it is doubtful that there would have been any attendance at the

school. On the left is Charlie Jan Wann, second is Rev. McLean, Third and fourth are not identified, fifth is Joe Ah Jew, and sixth is Bro. Otis.

This description of the event is undocumented although it sounds like a news paper report:

'The Congregational church was packed to its fullest capacity last evening with Prescott's ladies and gentlemen, to witness the entertainment given by the Chinese school of the church. The entertainment was gotten up entirely by the Chinese pupils, and the programs arranged by them. By way of introduction, T. W. Otis, superintendent of the school, made a statement giving a brief history of the school. It was started last March with ten pupils, and this number has increased during the year to thirty-five. The prime object of the school has been to teach the pupils the English language, but where it was agreeable to them, religious instruction has also been given to a voluntary choice of pupils. The programme included the singing of two hymns in the Chinese language by the school, led by Rev. T. D. McLean, who mastered enough of the Chinese language, to sing them. They were "There is a Happy Land" and "Stand up for Jesus", the tunes being familiar American ones.

Lon Slung, a nineteen-year old boy, read a portion of a chapter from the New Testament in English and then read the same in Chinese, giving some of his views of it in Chinese also. His reading was quite distinct and clear, and showed remarkable rapid progress in the language, considering the fact that he has been less than a year acquiring his knowledge of it.

Charley Wan, a well known Chinaman, gave a reading and also told a Chinese story about Mon Gee Hing in English, according to his own translation. The latter was particularly interesting, as some of his translations were particularly modern, and was in English as it is spoken, rather than written. An illustration being that in describing Mon Gee Hing's anger he stated that "he got hot" and other similar import.

The Chirography of Lon Shung and Charley Wan is particularly good, being far better than that of the average American. Kim Sam received an encore from the audience for a selection played on a Chinese harp, an instrument of quite sweet tones, although the music was peculiarly Chinese. Chen Chung, Lou Dick, and Quen Long Hing gave an orchestrated selection on a Chinese fiddle, a banjo, and flute.

After the exercises were over a very elaborate lunch consisting of ice cream, cake, nuts, and oranges was served to all present. 3

The last we hear from the school, other than individual expressions of memories, is from the Arizona Journal Miner, August 12, 1919:

'The Methodist Church mission school established 25 years ago by T. W. Otis, merchant, "to uplift the Celestial population of Prescott by means of Church endeavors" (heathen pot wrestlers and laundry men) was sold and dismantled.' The article says that they petitioned the court for permission to sell.
