A MESSAGE FROM OUR TREASURER

We were so thrilled to receive a grant of \$24,250 from the Small Business Administration for the Paycheck Protection Program! As it turns out, we didn't actually qualify for this grant and the funds have now been returned.

This may seem as a bit of a let-down, but in reality it's a GOOD THING! We are so blessed to have received generous donations and bequests from past members, which we hold in reserve for emergencies or non-budget expenses. Much of these gifts were received with no restrictions placed by the donors. And because of these unrestricted funds, the SBA does not consider our church in need of the covid-19 relief stimulus grant.

So, where does that leave us, financially? We currently have a budget which anticipates a shortfall of more than \$32,000. In order to close that gap, we must consider reducing our spending, or we must receive more income—either from increased donations or from relying on our reserves. Remember, the reserve funds are NOT UNLIMITED! And their intended use was never for regular budget expenses.

Added to the challenge of a deficit budget, we also have the new challenges created by the pandemic and the need for closing the church building to all activities, including meetings and worship. Your church cabinet is working hard, and praying hard, to work out a revised budget which allows for a potential decrease in income and offsets the deficit by decreasing budget spending. We'll keep you posted!


MISSION OUTREACH NEWS


PASTOR JAY'S SABBATICAL
