Proverbs 25:11-12 The Message Version:

The right word at the right time is like a custom-made piece of jewelry, And a wise friend's timely reprimand is like a gold ring slipped on your finger.

This Sunday we turn our attention to the story of David and Abigail (1 Samuel 25).

Abigail's intervention saves David from his vengeance and murder of Nabal. The truth of David's story is the same for us - we have been

"saved" many times by the intervention of others and God. The right word at the right time. A timely reprimand. A calming presence to moderate our rage. A word of wisdom. Thank God for Abigails! I think this is a neglected aspect of the spiritual life. We will think about those interventions during the sermon.




MISSIONS AND OUTREACH NEWS

Thanks to your generous giving, we delivered a \$1070 check to the Coalition for Compassion and Justice in support of this year's "Fair Start." Approximately 1,000 backpacks were packed with school supplies for students in grades K-12.

Now, and continuing through the month of August, our mission emphasis is the Discovery Gardens Preschool. The Discovery Gardens student body includes students who are developmentally challenged as well as those whose parents are living at or below the federal poverty level. In addition to this, we are also supporting a Discovery Gardens scholarship fund. This fund will help enable the attendance of three-year old children whose parents are in need of financial assistance.

STAND AGAINST HUMAN TRAFFICKING

In 2013, the UN designated <u>July 30th</u> as the <u>World Day against</u> <u>Trafficking in Persons</u>. Although the numbers vary, it's estimated that nearly <u>25 million people</u> are exploited for profit. Human trafficking, also known as modern slavery, is said to be one of the most profitable forms of transnational crime. Traffickers prey on the vulnerable, forcing them into labor and/or exploiting them in commercial sexual enterprises. Migrants and refugees are especially susceptible and are often targeted by traffickers.

In 2009, the United Church of Christ's General Synod passed a <u>Resolution</u> urging congregations to engage in action to end human trafficking by educating their members. We have tools at our disposal to combat trafficking. Now we need Congress to act. Call on the House to reauthorize the Trafficking Victims Protection Act (TVPA).

Faithful Witness at the Border

Faith In Action Many people have asked us, "What can we do beyond giving money?"

The Southwest Conference is calling for a week of Faithful Witness at the Border, August 26 - 30, 2018 that will include:

- A humanitarian mission to the Mexican side of the border to visit and take supplies to asylumseekers in shelters and camped out at the ports of entry due to a slowdown in applications being received.
- Solidarity actions at the detention facilities in Eloy and Florence where parents of kids separated from their families are being held.
- Training and strategy sessions around 'Being an Immigrant Welcoming Congregation' and 'Acting as an Advocate and Ally' with members from the UCC Washington office
- Conversations with local ministry partners in Arizona The Samaritans and other immigration ministry groups.
- A visit to Operation Streamline immigration court where parents whose children were taken away are appearing in the hope of finding their kids.

- Set up in-district visits with your members of Congress to share your UCC faith witness on immigration.
- Submit letters to the editor and editorials in your local and regional papers.
- Raising money and collecting supplies for humanitarian relief at the border—

PLEASE USE THIS VERY SPECIFIC LIST OF SUPPLIES.

- Writing letters of welcome IN SPANISH that can be distributed to asylum seekers as missives of love and welcome, an alternative message to the government (No need for example letter. The ones we are getting are terrific)
- Fundraising to support living expenses of migrants seeking asylum and who are prohibited by law from holding employment in the US while their case is processed.
- Participate in an immigrant detention visitation program in your area (https://www.freedomforimmigrants.org/visitation-network/)
- Partner with local immigrant rights groups to join/organize a rally at an immigrant detention facility for adults, ICE office, or border patrol station nearby. (https://www.ice.gov/detention-facilities)
- Host a fellowship event with a local migrants/an immigrant group in your community to get to know one another and listen to their stories.
- Contributing to the UCC "Keep Families Together" campaign.
