Throughout the year, we continue to help documented immigrant students needing assistance to meet their educational expenses. Most of our aid has been to assist Franceny Gardea, a junior at Prescott College, Franciso Gardea, a senior at the U of A. Donations to our DACA Fund are always welcome.

The immigration event we helped to plan and present September 21 at the Methodist Church was attended by over 200 people. Panelists addressed current government immigration laws, policies and practices. Guest speakers included an immigration attorney from Phoenix, an ordained Methodist immigration worker, the Humbolt-Dewey School Superintendent, and an area immigrant. Although they chose to decline, local law agencies were invited to be a part of our panel.



Monthly we provide a hot meal for women, and women with children staying at the Prescott Area Shelter Services (PASS). 
meal to those staying at the CCJ Shelter. If interested, please see the sign-up sheet in Perkins Hall.

HOMOSEXUALITY AND THE BIBLE

The United Church of Christ and the Bible Q&A Look for copies of these booklets on the education table in Perkins Hall. They are quick reads that give insight into our UCC beliefs.



- What is the Bible? Do we believe in the Bible?
- When was the Bible written and how?
- If the Bible was written by people a long time ago and over such a long time, how can it be so important? How can it be a revelation?
- Why do Christians read from the Bible...and not from other great literature or the writings of other religions?
- What is 'the canon'? What translation should we read?

Four biblical scholars succinctly address these questions and also suggest "Fifteen passages to know by heart" and "Twelve great reads." Martin B. Copenhaver intriguingly finishes with a page called "The Really Hard Parts: the parts that—for one reason or another, in one way or another—frustrate, baffle, or even offend."

Stillspeaking Bible Study (also free! And to share). Nine theologians offer short but thoughtful interpretations and study questions on:

- Genesis 28: 10-17
- Exodus 3: 7-15
- Joshua 1: 1-9
- Isaiah 43: 15-19
- Luke 18: 35-43
- 2 Corinthians 4: 3-6
- Acts 10: 34-48
- John 2: 1-11
- John 16: 12-13

Their comments are shaped by the UCC guiding principles: "Never place a period where God has placed a comma" And "God hath yet more light and truth to break forth from God's Holy Word."

Homosexuality and the Bible by Walter Wink (Fellowship Publications, 2005). This straightforward and knowledgeable booklet's chapters are: "Unequivocal Condemnations"; "Hebrew Sexual Mores"; "The Problem of Authority"—certain rules, especially in the Old Testament, are no longer binding; "Judge for Yourselves" and "An Appeal for Tolerance" revised in consultation with Dr. Amy-Jill Levine. Wink gives us a new and modern interpretation of biblical scriptures on this topic. These are also free and more can be ordered.



"What the Bible Really says about Gay Christians may Surprise you!" written by our own South West conference president Rev. Dr. William Lyons. This is the text of a seminar he gave at St. John's United Church of Christ, Grand Rapids, MI. "Participants in this seminar can expect to:

- Broaden their understanding of what it means to hear God's voice,
- Expand their ability to understand and appreciate the wide variety of beliefs and opinions other people of faith hold about homosexuality and the Bible,
- Grow more confident in the Biblical grounding for their own views about homosexuality, and
- Increase the frequency with which they turn to Scripture as an authoritarian resource for understanding and responding to other difficult social issues.

This is a fascinating and thorough approach to examining how we and others interpret the Bible on this issue in particular, "[taking] the first steps toward overcoming polarization that prevents us from engaging in meaningful dialogue with one another about difficult issues in light of Scripture, and practicing what the Bible says about more basic topics, namely, practicing love toward all people."

One copy is on the table but it can be freely copied. Copies of the other booklets will be ordered if needed. Read and enjoy and learn more about our United Church of Christ denomination.


