Jacob Wrestling with the Angel, Marc Chagall, 1887-1985 This Sunday we have two scripture passages, Luke 18:1-10 and Genesis 32:22-31, that teach us that faith means persistence, tenacity, and not losing heart. We accomplish this through prayer. The title of the sermon comes from the late Fred Craddock, professor of preaching: "Faith with Bloody Knuckles." Jesus presents us with a parable about a widow who keeps pestering an unjust judge until he grants her request. One of those "how much more will God respond" parables of contrast. Still, we all know the reality of knocking until our knuckles bleed and still no answer. But sometimes like Jacob we wrestle with God(?) all night and walk away with a blessing and a new name. What is the Christian life? It's wrestling with God! I like that. So, this Sunday no easy answers or "prosperity gospel" but true to life persistence, tenacity, and faith.

Last century there was a tavern being built in a town that had previously been dry. In opposition to the tavern, a group of Christians gathered for an all-night prayer meeting and asked God to intervene. Lightning struck the tavern and it burned to the ground. The tavern owner brought a lawsuit against the Christians, holding them responsible. The Christians hired an attorney and denied responsibility. In the courtroom, the judge responded to this unusual scenario: "No matter how this case comes out, one thing is clear. The tavern owner believes in prayer and the Christians do not!"

The immigration event we helped to plan and present September 21 at the Methodist Church was attended by over 200 people. Panelists addressed current government immigration laws, policies and practices. Guest speakers included an immigration attorney from Phoenix, an ordained Methodist immigration worker, the Humbolt-Dewey School Superintendent, and an area immigrant. Although they chose to decline, local law agencies were invited to be a part of our panel.

Monthly we provide a hot meal for women, and women with children staying at the Prescott Area Shelter Services (PASS).
