SUNDAY TOPIC:

Lenten Series:

"A Path to Spiritual Wholeness"

(Jesus Grew in Wisdom and Stature; In Favor with God and Others) During the Lenten Season, we will use a tool produced by the ELCA – Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. We will look at our spirituality from a holistic approach, culminating in Easter Sunday.

Our Lenten journey has taken us almost to Passion/Palm Sunday. The fourth gospel prepares us by placing Mary's anointing of Jesus' feet with expensive perfume right before the entry into Jerusalem. Our Lenten series topic is financial well-being. Most of the time we are conservative when it comes to money, but sometimes love causes us to splurge (an ice sculpture at a summer wedding). Mary's love for Jesus caused her to spend lavishly. Most of our days are calculated and calm. Sometimes, like Mary, we are lifted clear out of arithmetic into love. How has that happened for us? MONTHLY FOCUS: Each month we highlight a different mission outreach project/program. For the month of April, our highlighted program is One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS).

One Great Hour of Sharing is one of four annual special mission offerings of the United Church of Christ. Donations support denominational programs of Health, Education, Agriculture, Disaster Relief, and Refugee Camp ministries. The theme for 2022 is Love Remains, based on 1 Corinthians 13.

In the theme scripture, the Apostle Paul helped newly converted Christians at Corinth embrace the virtue of love. Love is an active decision to think of others before self; to work on behalf of others; and to care for others with acts of kindness and advocacy. Paul taught that community is less about "me" and more about "us."

This ministry of compassion is a result of the love Paul called the church to, and the love we will continue to witness through your generosity and gifts given through the One Great Hour of Sharing offering. Please let Pastor Jay know if you are interested in joining the church. If you cannot be here on Easter, another Sunday will be possible. What is involved in joining? As part of our extravagant welcome here, we have tried to remove barriers to joining as much as possible. There is no creed or statement of faith required. We value diversity of belief. There is an hour-long orientation to the church on YouTube that can be viewed. At the worship service on the day of joining, you will be asked to come up front, and Pastor Jay will introduce you to the congregation. You will be asked the following questions: Do you desire to follow in the way of Jesus and listen to his teachings? Will you be a faithful member of this congregation, supporting its ministry, and using your gifts and talents here as you have opportunity? A prayer for you and a "welcome" follows!

Here is information regarding membership in our bylaws:

ARTICLE V: MEMBERSHIP

This church welcomes into its fellowship any person who subscribes to the teachings of Jesus Christ. Membership is open to all without regard to age, race, gender, sexual orientation, ethnicity, gender identity, faith, marital status, and personal ability. Members may participate in any activity of this church and may

serve in an elected or appointed position of leadership. Members have the right to vote at any Annual or Special Meeting.

Membership may be determined as follows: 1. By satisfactory and public profession of the Christian faith as evidenced by the covenant of this church with the United Church of Christ. 2. By the rite of Confirmation in this church. 3. By a letter of transfer from another Christian Church. Members covenant to participate fully in the life of the congregation by: 1. Attending worship, 2. Celebrating Communion, 3. Seeking to learn about and understand Holy Scripture and its implications for our lives as Christians, 4. Sharing time and talent dedicated to church work, 5. And supporting the financial and spiritual welfare of the membership and community to the best of their ability.

Full rights and privileges of membership are granted to those members wishing to retain membership with other Christian Churches. Members shall be granted, on request, a letter of transfer to another church. Church membership rolls will be updated periodically by members of the Cabinet. 3 We recognize as friends those who are active in the life of First Congregational Church, but who choose not to join as members. They share fully in the spiritual life of this church and may participate in all its programs and activities. Friends may serve with the Ministries, but are ineligible to serve on the Cabinet or be elected an Officer. Friends are also granted the privilege of voice without vote at any Annual or Special Meeting. The United Church of Christ (UCC) is a distinct and diverse community of Christians that come together as one church to join faith and action. With over 5,000 churches and nearly one million members across the U.S., the UCC serves God in the co-creation of a just and sustainable world. The UCC is a church of firsts, a church of extravagant welcome, and a church where "...they may all be one" (John 17:21).

The Church of Firsts

Since 1957, the United Church of Christ has been the church of firsts, weaving God's message of hope and extravagant welcome with action for justice and peace. Together, we live out our faith in ways that effect change in our communities. The UCC's many "firsts" mean that we have inherited a tradition of acting upon the demands of our faith. When we read in Galatians: "There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus"—a demand is made upon us. And so we were the first historically white denomination to ordain an African-American, the first to ordain a woman, the first to ordain an openly gay man, and the first Christian church to affirm the right of same-gender couples to marry. We were in the forefront of the anti-slavery movement and the Civil Rights movement. Our response to the demands of our faith is woven into the history of our country.
