From the Pastor

What an amazing worship service last Sunday! After twenty or so inches of snow during the week, we thought maybe fifty would brave the cold and snow and come to worship. We ended up with ninety-nine attending and fifteen children! The children collected our "souper bowl" offering and decided it should go to St. Jude Children's Hospital in Memphis. The offering total was \$297.16. Thanks to the children!

This Sunday is the first Sunday in Lent. We will look at Mark's account of Jesus' temptation in the wilderness (Mark 1:9-15). Lent is often thought of as a somber season of giving up something for God. Lent is a time for repentance, to be sure, but repentance means to turn, so repentance can be a positive turning toward God's intentions for us. And God's intentions for us are for our own good. So, think of Lent as a time to evaluate our lives and turn toward more positive paths and habits. Our spiritual path requires continual repentance/turning as we stumble, dust ourselves off, and begin again. The cycle is captured in the following exchange: "The Road to Holiness." A seeker after truth came to a saint for guidance. "Tell me, wise one, how did you become holy?" "Two words." "And what are they, please?" "Right choices." The seeker was fascinated. "How does one learn to choose rightly?" "One word." "One word! May I have it, please?" the seeker asked. "Growth." The seeker was thrilled. "How does one grow?" "Two words." "What are they, pray tell?" "Wrong choices."

FEBRUARY MISSION NEWS

MONTHLY FOCUS: Each month throughout the year, our Mission Outreach team identifies particular mission programs to support. Our emphasis for February is **Prescott Area Shelter Services (PASS)**.

Prescott Area Shelter Services (PASS) provides shelter for local women and children in need. A donation of just \$28 can mean a new chance for a guest in need, a chance to feel safe, a chance to feel supported, and a chance to start the process of getting back on their feet. Your \$28 contribution gives shelter and all of **PASS's** support programs, including case management, to one guest for a night.

Other amounts to consider: \$50 will supply the shelter with toilet paper for at least two months; \$100 sponsors 10 days of shelter for one person (one day can change the life of a person); \$400 will supply shelter to a full dorm of guests for a

week, along with staff support, the resources and supplies needed, and a warm and safe environment; \$500 will support a family for one month

through **PASS's** Transitional Housing Program; and \$1000 helps one family or two single women obtain permanent housing.

If you wish to contribute, please make your check payable to the church, with the memo of **PASS**. Mission donations which do not specify a particular project will be disbursed as determined by our Mission team members.

In January, due to your generous support, the Mission Outreach team distributed funds to the following organizations/projects: Yavapai Food Bank (\$250), Ukraine Relief (\$1,020), and the UCC Christmas Fund (\$895).

As always, thank you for remembering that we are blessed to be a blessing (Genesis 12:2).

ENNEAGRAM WORKSHOP COMING MAY 18

We did this workshop back in 2016. Participants enjoyed getting to know themselves better and understanding others better. An Enneagram instructor will be leading the workshop. There will be a fee for attending – scholarships will be available if needed.

From The Enneagram Institute:

What is the Enneagram?

Don Riso has defined the Enneagram as "a geometric figure that delineates the nine basic personality types of human nature and their complex interrelationships." While the Enneagram suggests that there are nine basic personality types of human nature, there are, of course, many subtypes and variations within the nine fundamental categories. Nevertheless, the assertion of Enneagram theory is that these nine adequately map out the territory of "personality types."

The Enneagram is also a symbol that maps out the ways in which the nine types are related to each other. This is the aspect of the Enneagram most people are familiar with because it offers them a framework for understanding themselves and everyone they deal with. As a psychospiritual typology, the Enneagram helps people to recognize and understand an overall pattern in human behavior. External behaviors, underlying attitudes, one's characteristic sense of self, conscious and unconscious motivations, emotional reactions, defense mechanisms, object relations, what we pay attention to, our spiritual potentials and much more—are all parts of a complex pattern that forms each personality type. Therapists, business counselors, human resource directors, and spiritual seekers from around the world are all finding the Enneagram to be immensely useful for self-understanding and personal growth. Always remember however, that the Enneagram does not put you in a box; it shows you the box you are in and the way out!

What use is the Enneagram? How can it help me?

The Enneagram can be extremely useful to everyone as a source of self-knowledge because it acts as a kind of "mirror" to reveal features of our personality that normally are invisible to us. Most of the time, people function habitually, as if on "automatic pilot," according to the pattern of their basic personality type. Usually this allows people to get along well enough in their lives, but when their normal routines break down or the stresses of their lives increase too much, their normal way of coping also tends to break down or become dysfunctional. Seeing clearly what our habitual patterns are—seeing what we are doing and why we are doing it, and at what cost to ourselves and others—holds the key to our liberation. By knowing your type correctly, you are able to see yourself—to "catch yourself in the act"—as you move throughout the day. With this increased self-awareness, you are also able to avoid reacting in negative and potentially dangerous ways.

Once real balance has been restored to the personality structure, the Enneagram can help us to orient ourselves to the higher spiritual and psychological qualities that each type has in abundance. Thus, at its highest, the Enneagram invites us to look deeply into the mystery of our true identity. It reveals that we are not our personality, but something more—a spiritual being who has lost contact with his or her true nature. Living out of this realization shifts completely how we see ourselves, others, and the world, bringing liberation, freedom, and joy. 
TREASURER REPORT FOR YEAR-END 2023
