A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JAY

Lent has begun! On the first Sunday of Lent, we will focus on the traditional first Sunday theme of Jesus' temptation in the wilderness (Matthew 4:1-11). If you have visited St. Mark's Basilica in Venice, there is a mosaic in the church that illustrates the three temptations very well - see if you can remember what the three were from looking at the mosaic.

"It is not that suffering or failure might happen, or that it will only happen to you if you are bad

No, it will happen, and to you! Losing, failing, falling, sin, and the suffering that comes those experiences - all of this is a necessary and even good part of the human journey." "There are several good protections against temptation, but the surest is cowardice" (Mark Twain)




Tapestry & PUG Concert! March 7 @ 3:00 pm - 4:15 pm
