





Pete Norum has donated a book he read and recommends called *The Boy at the Back of the Class* by Onjali Q. Rauf. This from the inside flap: "On the third Tuesday of the school year, a new kid arrives in Mrs. Khan's class—Ahmet, a Syrian refugee. Everyone is curious about the newcomer, especially since he never smiles and doesn't talk much either. Still, one student is determined to become his friend and learns that standing up for others has the incredible potential to change an entire community for the better."



I read this book and found it touching and enlightening and inspiring. It is set in the UK and the author is the founder and CEO of Making HerStory, a UK nonprofit working to fight human trafficking and gender-based abuses and crimes. She lives in the UK.

Ms. Rauf includes at the end of the book questions of what we can do about these issues and also the helpful distinctions of migrant, immigrant, and refugee. The book is aimed at older children and young adults but anyone with a heart for these global crises can learn and enjoy. Marti Garrison


