From the Pastor

I hope you enjoy the historic art on the front of the bulletin on most Sundays. I enjoy finding it and looking up the museums or historic places the art resides. An appreciation of art and history informs our faith. This Sunday we will hear Jesus tell the parable of the sower, so I found a sower from a 12th century nun to put on the bulletin cover (see below). Circa 1180. Herrad of Landsberg (Latin: Herrada Landsbergensis; c. 1130 – July 25, 1195) was a 12th-century Alsatian nun and abbess of Hohenburg Abbey in the Vosges mountains (near Strasbourg). She was known as the author of the pictorial encyclopedia Hortus deliciarum (The Garden of Delights). Herrad led the women of the Abbey in an education equal to the men of her time!

The other interesting choice could have been the sower that resides on top of the Nebraska state capital building, representing the state's agricultural heritage. You can see what obscure facts I learn about searching for art! Atop the 400 foot tower of the Nebraska State Capitol stands a figure casting the seeds of life to the winds...the Sower. Agriculture is the foundation upon which Nebraskans have built a noble life. The monumental sculpture was created by New York sculptor, Lee Lawrie. He represents this timeless symbol of Agriculture as a barefoot man, shirt sleeves and pant legs rolled up as he works, wearing a sun hood.

In Matthew 13, Jesus tells a parable about a farmer throwing seeds all over the place, and how they fall on the path, the rocks, among the thorns, and on good soil. Jesus gives an interpretation that compares us with these four types of soil. It is an invitation for us to consider what type of soil we are. We will examine this Sunday.

Until then, I leave you with some words and ideas of Thomas Merton. Having lived in Louisville, Kentucky, I became familiar with the writings of this Roman Catholic monk who belonged to a Trappist monastery near Bardstown, Kentucky:

Every moment and every event of every person's life on earth plants something in her or his soul. For just as the wind carries thousands of winged seeds, so each moment brings with it germs of spiritual vitality that come to rest imperceptibly in the minds and wills of men and women. Most of these unnumbered seeds perish and are lost, for such seeds as these cannot spring up anywhere except in the good soil of freedom, spontaneity and love. Merton goes on to suggest we introduce toxins into our inner soil through our fear, anxiety, and selfishness.

We gather on Sunday morning to allow God to till our soil! Denise Nasso is our musical guest; Tom is liturgist; and JJ & Ziggy garden.
