This Sunday Jesus will teach us how to pray (Luke 11:1-13). Most of us are in elementary school when it comes to the subject of prayer, so any help from Jesus will be much appreciated! Maybe a childlike faith is best since prayer is such a mystery. Too much analysis leads to paralysis. I have spent hours this week researching one Greek word in this text: "anaideia." Most of our Bible versions translate it as "persistence" or "boldness." The Greek word occurs only here in Luke in the Bible, but every other time it is used in Greek literature it is translated "shamelessness." Why am I in the weeds with this word? Not just to validate years spent learning New Testament Greek, but also to dispel a common misinterpretation of Jesus' parable of the Friend at Midnight – persistent prayer will finally wear God down to give us what we ask. No, giving the Greek word the proper translation of "shamelessness" leads us to a much better view of God and ourselves. Carole Sue and harpist Anne provide music along with Brian. DOING JUSTICE

New webinar series focuses on how churches can embrace justice covenants

by <u>Staff Reports</u> | published on Jul 11, 2022 A yearlong series of United Church of Christ webinars is underway, highlighting Christian social justice programs available to local churches. The monthly "Just World Covenants" program kicked off during Pride month with "Open and Affirming: The Power of Covenant." A recording of it is now available here, at the UCC YouTube channel.

This was the first webinar in a yearlong series on the many social-justice emphases that local churches can embrace.

Coming episodes are listed below.

The very existence of the series signals how justice issues are connected, said the Rev. Brooks Berndt. He's the UCC environmental justice minister who helped introduce a new UCC Just World Covenants website at the 2021 General Synod. That site collects, in one place, links and information to various UCC justice-related programs.

"Justice does not stay in neat, separate boxes when it comes to the lived realities of our world," Berndt said. "Neither should our ministries. There is a lot of strength and vitality to be found in coming together."

Berndt said each webinar will emphasize ways that local churches can be deliberate and public about Christian social justice.

"Through General Synod resolutions and the dedicated efforts of numerous local churches, the UCC has developed over the years a number of designations that encourage and recognize specific ministries of justice," he said.

"These designations express a core dimension of our faith. They represent our commitment to building a just world for all. Those of us involved in these programs realized it made a lot of sense to bring them together through an online hub and through collaborative endeavors like this webinar series."

Since 1957, the United Church of Christ has been the <u>church of firsts</u>, weaving God's message of hope and extravagant welcome with action for justice and peace. Together, we live out our faith in ways that effect change in our

communities. The UCC's many "firsts" mean that we have inherited a tradition of acting upon the demands of our faith. When we read in Galatians: "There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus"—a demand is made upon us. And so we were the first historically white denomination to ordain an African-American, the first to ordain a woman, the first to ordain an openly gay man, and the first Christian church to affirm the right of same-gender couples to marry. We were in the forefront of the anti-slavery movement and the Civil Rights movement. Our response to the demands of our faith is woven into the history of our country.
