Just in time for summer vacations, Jesus offers an invitation to find rest (Matthew 11:28). The Apostle Paul offers a familiar struggle from Romans 7 - I realize that I don't have what it takes. I can will it, but I can't do it. I decide to do good, but I don't really do it; I decide not to do bad, but then I do it anyway. My decisions, such as they are, don't result in actions. Something has gone wrong deep within me and gets the better of me every time. ²¹⁻²³ It happens so regularly that it's predictable. The moment I decide to do good, sin is there to trip me up. I truly delight in God's commands, but it's pretty obvious that not all of me joins in that delight. Parts of me covertly rebel, and just when I least expect it, they take charge. ²⁴ I've tried everything and nothing helps. I'm at the end of my rope. Is there no one who can do anything for me? Isn't that the real question? ²⁵ The answer, thank God, is that Jesus Christ can and does. He acted to set things right in this life of contradictions where I want to serve God with all my heart and mind but am pulled by the influence of sin to do something totally different.

How can we find the rest Jesus offers? Rest from our internal struggles; rest from our own mind. We will explore on Sunday. One of the ways we will find it is through music - Dave Russell will be our musical guest on sax and flute (Dave will be playing on the square July 18 as part of the summer music on the square series). JJ and Ziggy model rest through meditation.


PICTURE DIRECTORY OF CONGREGATION
