His anger at this situation leads him to disrupt business in the Temple. When the church becomes comfortable with injustice; when the church and its pastors are silent regarding racism; when the church and its pastors are comfortable with white supremacy, perhaps we should ask what Jesus would do to disrupt our focus on ourselves. Mission Outreach Update for March:

Each month we highlight a different mission outreach project/program. For the month of March, our highlighted program is the **Prescott Area Habitat for Humanity**. **[PAHH].** Affordable housing continues to be a problem across America. Our Tri-City area is no exception. In Arizona, one in seven households spends half or more of its income on housing. Low income families are finding it more-n-more difficult to move from paying rental fees to home mortgages. PAHH provides qualified applicants a pathway to investing in their own home. Families approved by PAHH contribute "sweat equity" and pay a monthly mortgage based upon their income. CHURCH FOUNDATION

The congregation of the First Congregational Church established and incorporated the FIRST CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH FOUNDATION (FCCF), as a separate legal entity, on March 24, 1993, as a not-for-profit corporation. The sole member of the FCCF is the First Congregational Church, and the Church granted the FCCF full authority to administer the funds of the FCCF.

As of the 2021 Annual Meeting of the Church, the following are the nine members of the Board of Directors: David Foote, Susan Lemons, James Christopher, Julie McCurdy, Patty Lantrip, Sue Hodge-Parker, Alice Kring, Tom Macy, and Rev. Jay Wilcher.

To fund the FCCF, the members of the Church made legacy gifts to provide monies for it to continue its mission into the future. There are presently eleven (11) funds, ten (10) of which are "memorial endowment funds" and five (5) of which contain restrictions relating to the usage of the funds and/or the time of each expenditure. These funds are used to support the religious, educational and charitable purposes of the church and to support the needs of the church which are not encompassed in the church's budget. The FCCF manages these funds.

The FCCF is a vehicle for church members to invest in the church's future. These legacy gifts may take any one of a number of forms from memorials, testamentary trusts, living trusts, charitable donations, bequests, etc. In the coming weeks, The Caller will include information on legacy gifts for your consideration.

As of January 31 total income is \$8,159 Total expenses are \$10,101. Total Expenses exceed Income by \$1,942.

Year-to-date income is at 7% of the income budget of \$122,450. Year-to-date expenses are at 8% of the expense budget of \$146,905.
