### NOVEMBER MISSION NEWS

November's Outreach Mission project is the Coaltion for Compassion and Justice (CCJ). CCJ has transitioned from primarily being an emergency shelter for those who are homeless. It now helps clients find permanent affordable housing. Once housing upwards of 50 clients a night, CCJ now has helped dozens of those clients into mobile homes, cottage homes, apartments and lodge style facilities. Additionally, CCJ works with other agencies to help provide rental assistance. Our pastor served as president of the board from 2017-2019

This year we completed the renovation of our Madison Ave facility. The Madison Ave location now includes our " Second Chance" thrift store, emergency shelter space, and offices for our CCJ staff.

CCJ also offers programs for job opportunities. Through our "Workers for Work" program clients have access to vehicles which have been donated. Through our "Prescott Worker's Progress Agency" program, clients are trained and employed to perform landscaping jobs throughout community.

Donation checks can be made payable to the church with the memo, CCJ. As always, thank you for remembering that we have been blessed to be a blessing. (Genesis12:2)

Grace-giving God, we come before you to worship, to praise and to thank you for your generous and gracious acceptance of our worship - imperfect as it is. We confess that we are so obsessed with our own small issues and concerns that we are unable to offer you all that we are in our worship of you. Jesus taught his followers to love and worship God "...*with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind*... [and] *your neighbor as yourself*."; and we confess that we only offer to God, parts of our heart and soul; and we seldom offer very much of our mind to God! Forgive us for our lack of true commitment to the worship of God; and the way we limit ourselves in our acts of worship. ### PROCLAIMING GOD'S WORD

Hebrew Scripture Reading: Psalm 98

A Meditation on Psalm 98

Pastor Jay

Some communities exhibit considerable substance in their worship but little joy or enthusiasm in the praise of God. Others show great enthusiasm but little substance. This psalm [98] expresses powerful reasons for praising God – Israel's historical memory and God's coming to bring justice. The psalm weds the emotion and the intellect, both of which are vital to the praise of God...The psalms include both the memory of God's mighty acts on behalf of the community and the reminder that these mighty acts have implications for all creation.... Psalm 98 suggests that the journey inward and the journey outward are both essential to the full worship of the divine king..."3 Jesus' teaching on this subject finds the right balance: "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. A second is equally important: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'

Many have given testimony to finding healing here from other church experiences, where God was presented as judgmental and exclusionary. Other churches have retreated to locations out of town. We have remained here on Gurley Street, downtown, easily seen, accessible and welcoming to all.

#### **IMMEDIATE NEED**

Another answer to why you would want to give to your church revolves around need, both yours and this Church's. You obviously have any number of personal reasons or needs that lead you into church participation here, where you find those needs met. Your church also has needs and right now those needs are financial. We are in unprecedented times. How do we create a church budget for 2022 with so many unknowns? How do you decide what to give to this church for 2022? When will we be able to fully open our church and return to worship? These questions have no immediate answers, so our church budget and your offer of financial giving are not set in stone. They are estimates. Your estimate of giving for 2022 will help us begin to understand what might be possible for the next year. So, with a thankful heart full of hope we are asking you to help us right now, to get through our 142<sup>nd</sup> year here in Prescott.
