From the Pastor

In last Sunday's sermon I referenced a book by two Stanford professors. The book is "Designing Your Life: How to Build a Well-Lived, Joyful life." I think it is due out soon.

Several of you have asked about the status of our church van. It took a while to pin down driver requirements from our insurance company, and for them to load our policy into their database so we could take their online safety test. Since it is under 15 passengers (seats 10), we do not have to have the special CDL driver's license to drive it, but our insurance company requires the passing of a safety test that is online:

GuideOne's requirement is that the church either needs to have a CDL driver (typical for 15+ pass vans whether seats are taken out or left in) or go thru a Defensive Driving Course. GuideOne offers such a course online thru SafeChurch.com (many free training sessions and materials for GuideOne Insureds, staff, and volunteers). The course will need to be passed and receipt or certificate sent into the carrier or our office.

Also, drivers over 70 need an additional medical form from a physician – the form is available in the office.

I have passed the test! Actually, it is very easy, so anyone interested in driving the van for church functions, let me know, and we will provide a link to the online test materials.

I will drive the van to our church picnic Sunday, so if you need a ride let me know.

I serve on the board of Coalition of Compassion and Justice, and at a recent board meeting we learned that CCJ is looking for a facility to house our expanding programs. In addition to the Open Door Resource and Advocacy Center, it would house the "Safe Legal Sleep" part of the ministry (around 50 homeless persons now sleep in the thrift store parking lot each night). We are hoping to have a building before winter sets in.

I include two program attachments below – one giving thanks for your efforts on helping kids get a fair start at school, and the other promoting the "warm for winter" efforts. Thanks to all you did and will do to support helping low-income families and children.


