BE THE CHURCH!

This Sunday we will be introducing our officers of the church to everyone. The Officers of the Church shall consist of the Moderator (John McCurdy), Vice-Moderator (Rev. Marti Garrison), Treasurer (Donna Bauman), and Clerk (Julie McCurdy).

MODERATOR: The Moderator shall serve for two years. The duties and responsibilities of the Moderator include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. Preside at all Cabinet Meetings. 2. Recommend the formation of Committees, as needed. 3. Appoint non-elected Ministry members as necessary, with Cabinet approval. 4. Communicate regularly with the Minister. 5. Participate, without vote, as ex officio member of all Ministries. 6. Delegate any of the duties or responsibilities to the Vice-Moderator.

VICE-MODERATOR: The Vice-Moderator shall serve for two years. In the absence of the Moderator, the Vice- Moderator shall assume all the duties and responsibilities of the Moderator.

CLERK: The Clerk shall serve for two years. Exception to this may be made by a majority vote of the Cabinet. The duties and responsibilities of the Clerk include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. Record business of Annual or Special Meetings and meetings of the Church Cabinet. All such minutes shall be distributed to each Cabinet member and the Minister, and made available to the congregation. 2. Maintain a register of the membership; maintain a record of baptisms, weddings, memorial services, and funerals. 3.Preserve and file all communications, documents, and written official reports. 4. Issue letters of transfer of membership; and inform the Cabinet of any changes in membership.

TREASURER: The Treasurer shall serve for two years. Exception to this may be made by a majority vote of the Cabinet. The Treasurer shall assist in the creation of the Church Budget and maintain a full and accurate account of all funds received, disbursed, or invested in the name of the church. The Treasurer is responsible for the timely submission of regulatory filings.
