From Pastor Jay

In our ever changing church environment, and as all churches navigate their way through uncharted waters, many times the way we used to do things no longer works. One of those slowly dying traditions is the old committee structure in the church. Gone are the days when members were willing to serve on committees. To test this truth, just ask someone to commit to a three year term on "X" committee and watch their facial expression! So, one current strategy is to replace the top-down model of forcing a structure on the congregation with a more organic one. This can look many ways, but one idea is to let ministries and programs "bubble up" from the gifts and interests of members of the congregation. Two recent examples can be found in our church.

Tawnya Worthington expressed a desire for us to have activities for the whole family rather than separating the parents and children. And she was willing to work to make it happen. Thus was born our Wednesday night family gathering called "P.I.E." – "Play, Inspire, Eat." Beginning September 16th, we will gather on Wednesday nights for ten weeks to share a meal, play and learn together as a church family.

Chuck Budinger has been attending our church regularly for the past months. He has an interest in helping us develop an environmental ministry. He works as an Environmental Coordinator for the Arizona Department of Transportation. So, we set up an initial meeting at church and Chuck discovered our own Jay Eby helped establish Prescott Creeks and provides a wealth of knowledge of local environmental efforts. Also attending the meeting because he saw our Facebook posting was Peter Pierson of Prescott Creeks! John McCurdy also works with Prescott College with their environmental concerns. There are others interested in this area, so it has "bubbled up" and gained some traction. A meeting will be held Wednesday, Sept. 30th at 6:30 p.m. to begin our journey into environmental ministry.

Allowing things to organically happen does not solve everything, of course. Allowance for failure has to be granted, and some things naturally run their course and need to be allowed to die. And some things need to be done whether there is any energy for them or not, but it sure helps when people discover their gifts and interests and put their energies in those areas. Theologian Frederick Buechner has written that "Vocation is where our greatest passion meets the world's greatest need." If God is nudging you to get involved in a particular ministry or way, let me know. We are open and affirming here! Blessings, Pastor Jay
