

Fifth Gathering -- March 21 "Spiritual Autobiographies Told Through the Lens of Race"

Sixth Gathering -- March 28 "On Becoming an Ally"



"We're halfway through our six-week Lenten Series on white privilege. In the first gathering, we laid the groundwork for recognizing white privilege in our society, and the ways in which it shapes individuals' worldviews. The second gathering focused on the American experience of race, with discussion of how the

received version of our history often is shaped by a white perspective. We watched an interview with Dr. Cornel West, who spoke about the Black prophetic tradition in the US, and discussed the value of seeing American history and society through the lens of race. In the third week, we talked about race and the church, discussing the ways in which familiar dimensions of our church experience often assume a white perspective. We watched a video discussing the experience of people of color in white-dominant churches. We also discussed passages of scripture that speak to our obligation to work for inclusion and justice.

In weeks ahead, we will examine the operations of white privilege in areas such as housing, healthcare and education. We'll consider our own spiritual autobiographies in relation to race, and we'll look at ways in which white people of faith can become allies to people of color."
